Dear Parents/Carers,

To celebrate 'World Book Day' on Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> March, we are inviting the children to come to school dressed as an 'adventurous adjective'.

To give you some examples, the children could choose to come:

- dressed as a dinosaur for dangerous,
- wearing a shirt and tie for stylish,
- wearing a plain t shirt decorated with their word drawn on it and pictures to illustrate it,
- dressed all in one colour to show a mood, such as grey to show miserable.

The children should have their word pinned or drawn on them, so they know what it is. We will be doing activities around these words during the school day to extend their vocabulary knowledge.

During the day the children will be taking part in a live 'Zoom' session with a famous author. The children in Reception and KS1 will enjoy hearing Catherine Rayner read some of her stories. The children in KS2 will enjoy hearing Michael Rosen perform some of his poetry.

As you arrive at school in the morning, we would like to invite parents and carers to come into the classrooms to share a story or book with your child, before lessons begin. You could read your child a story from their class library, your child could show you their favourite book or tell you about the class novel they are reading.

We will also be launching a 'Readathon' as our reading challenge for next half term. Further details regarding this will be sent out after half term.
